ACCESSING BLACKBOARD ON MOBILE DEVICES

Blackboard Mobile Learn App

Students who are interested in viewing course content from Blackboard on a smart phone or tablet may download the free <u>Blackboard Mobile</u> <u>App</u> from their device's app store.

Supported Devices Include: iPad, iPod (iOS 6.0+); Android (2.3+); Blackberry (OS 4.5.0 +); and Palm (WebOS 1.4.5+).

WHAT CAN I DO ON MY MOBILE DEVICE WITH THE APP?

YOU CAN:

- + Check your grades
- + Review announcements and tasks
- + View course documents and media
- + Take mobile-compatible tests
- + Post to discussions, journals, and blogs
- + Receive push notifications from classes

YOU CANNOT:

- + Submit assignments
- + Take non-mobile compatible tests
- + Use Blackboard's Virtual Classroom and Chat tools
- + Send course e-mail or messages

 After you have installed the app, open the application. When the application opens, tap on the words "Search for Your School" to view the searchbar.

- In the login form that appears, type your MATC network username and password in the appropriate fields, and then click the "Continue" button.

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ADVICE FOR COMPLETING TESTS AND ACTIVITIES ON MOBILE DEVICES

Please be aware of your device and the app's support for tools and assessments.

- Not all types of Blackboard assessments and tools will be available on a mobile device!
- The design and features of some tools may be in a more simplified format when accessed through the app.
- If your instructor provides mobile-compatible tests, you may access them through the Blackboard Learn app on Apple iOS 4.0+ or Android 2.2+ devices.

Be aware of your device's internet connectivity

- If you experience a failure of your Internet connection while you are completing a test or discussion board, blog, or journal entry, keep the assessment open and try to re-connect to the Internet immediately. If assessment is kept open and the connection is re-established, you may be able to successfully continue with and submit the assessment.
- If you are taking a test through a mobile Web browser and the screen freezes, try clicking a "Save" button next to one of the questions to save your progress. However, do not save each and every question as you are taking the test as this has been known to cause problems.



Avoid problems associated with Wi-Fi and lost internet connectivity – Complete high-stakes assessments on a PC with supported Web browser. If you experience a problem, contact your instructor right away!

Be aware of test formats

- Not all tests can be taken on a mobile device. Timed tests and tests protected by Respondus Lockdown Browser are generally not available on a mobile device and will require completion through a PC.
- Tests that use questions or test settings that are not compatible with mobile devices will appear in the course map with a message directing students to take the test through a PC with supported Web browser.
- Mobile-compatible tests will feature questions in the following supported formats:
 - o Multiple choice
 - Fill in the Blank
 - o True/False
 - o Calculated Numeric
 - Hot Spot (Diagram Labeling)
 - File Response (File Upload)
